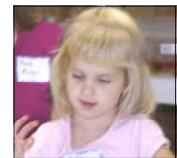

He has had primary responsibility for education and discipleship training there as well as many administrative functions. Prior to serving at Hatcher he was associate pastor for young married adults at First Baptist Church, Richmond, and served there seven years.

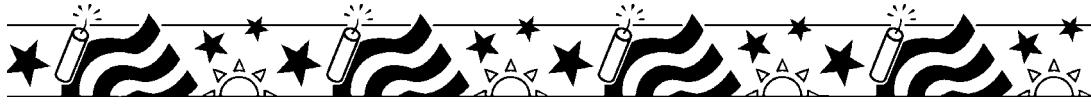

Ivor 100 Year Celebration

October 18, 2008

The quaint village of Ivor was established in 1858 and Incorporated as a Town in 1908. Many events have been planned for October 18th, beginning with a Celebration Parade at 10:00 AM. The parade route will leave the Pines of Ivor, go down Main Street, Gale Avenue, Babb Drive, onto Rawls Drive and back to Pines of Ivor.

There will be marching bands from Windsor and Smithfield High Schools, floats, old cars, Mr. Tom Saunders, our Grand Marshall and Key note speaker for opening ceremonies, fire engines, and rescue vehicles, Nottoway Elementary School Chorus, cloggers, golf cars, tractors, trains, General Lee Dukes of Hazard Car, Chick-Fil-A Cow, Shriners, horses, and of course the all famous pooper-scooper.

Following the National Anthem, sung by Linda Clifton and signed by Sharon Patterson, there will be a Patriotic Cantata presented by Ivor Community Chorus. Participants from Millfield include Bob and Jean Mitchell, Jack Hardt, Laine Magee, Becky Felts, Betsy Cutright, Patsy Warren, Nancy Stephenson and Sandy Vick. A tribute to all the branches of our Armed Forces is included in this moving Cantata "Spirit of America". Students from Nottoway Elementary will be helping with the narration. Soloists in the musical program are Jasmine Lane and Laine Magee.

Main stage events will continue throughout the day up until evening fireworks. Silver Street, Thunder Creek, Courtney Haywood, New Branch Choir, are just a few of the Main Stage Entertainment.

There will also be Craft Booths, Petting Zoo, Sky Divers, Donkey Soft Ball Game, Demonstrations, lots of food, Moon Walk and many bounce games for kids of all ages, Memorabilia displayed inside the Municipal Building, Old Cars, Glass Blowing by Mert Felts, Wood carving by Butch Kutcha, puppets, basket weaving, quilters and SO MUCH MORE!

Our Millfield Puppet Team will be entering a float and there is opportunity for the entire church to help man a booth selling baked goods. We have also been asked to help transport folks from several satellite parking areas to the park on our church van.

Our Ivor Postmaster is working on a special cancellation stamp for us to use during this Special Event. There will be ball caps and tee shirts for sale to commemorate the 100th Celebration Day. Alma Hunt Missions Offering – “Live It as You Go”

During the month of October we’ll be receiving the Alma Hunt Missions Offering. Our goal for the offering is \$3,000, and all the money stays here in Virginia to fund ministries of the Virginia Baptist Mission Board and the Woman’s Missionary Union (WMU) of Virginia.

Next Sunday we will have Prayer Guides available in the bulletin and an introduction to some of the ways the funds are used. Each Sunday in October we’ll hear how Alma Hunt Missions offering funds have directly benefited Millfield and some of our members. We’ll hear stories from those who participated in ministries funded by your gifts.

Did you know through the WMU you help support summer camp scholarships at Camp Crossroads for children who otherwise would not get to attend, or the Aging With Significance ministry equips older adults for using their skills to volunteer and helps meet the needs of caregivers of older adults? Or that mission opportunities are provided through Children In Action, Youth on Mission, and Woman on Mission both locally and across the state? Did you know WMU assists women who minister to women in the five correctional facilities in Virginia that house female inmates?

Through Alma Hunt gifts, Virginia Baptist Mission Board is helping start new churches, such as the True Word Church in Franklin. New churches are being started in almost every region of the state. VBMB funds also provide disaster relief personnel anytime a natural disaster strikes, and the Venturer program assists volunteers who serve for six months to two years in a mission location. MISSIONS: AROUND THE WORLD AND BACK AGAIN

This past summer, I spent two months in the Philippines serving with Virginia Baptist Mission Board Venturers, Bob and Celia Munson. After a brief respite in the United States for 48 hours, I traveled to Germany for a little over two weeks to do mission work and then attend the Baptist World Alliance Youth Conference.

In the Philippines, I participated in a variety of ministry opportunities. Through Dakilang Pagibig Diadem Ministries (“Divine Love”), I helped with medical missions in various locations. On the mission, working with the pharmacy was my main task, but I also assisted with surgical procedures. When not traveling to medical sites, the week was packed with other ministry opportunities. We began visiting a hygiene clinic to minister to nightclub workers and prostitutes. We also visited a battered women’s shelter to educate pregnant women about health and hygiene. On weekday mornings, I volunteered with a day care program for preschool aged children, and at Union International Church, I helped lead the youth group. Finally, my schedule was topped off with tutoring two students in English many evenings.

In the midst of that incredibly busy schedule, God provided an amazing opportunity to stay at an orphanage called Skekinah Home in the northern part of the Philippines. It was by far the highlight of my summer—singing songs, playing with the children, holding the babies... Hearing their stories of abuse and neglect brought my eyes to tears, but being able to be the arms of Jesus to them as I hugged them and played with them truly humbled me. Looking into the eyes of a child, I was able to experience Christ.

Even though my amazing summer came to an end in August, God continues to work in my life. I am excited about how God touched my life this summer in working with orphans and am preparing to join Him in His work in South Africa at Door of Hope over my school’s Christmas break. Door of Hope exists to provide a home for AIDS affected babies in South Africa. From December 22, 2008 to January 14, 2009, I will have the opportunity to take part in Christ’s ministry there. I stand amazed at all the things God has done in my life thus far and know that the plans he has for me are “immeasurably more than I can ask or imagine” (Ephesians 3:20).

Transition Team Reactivated

During the time that the Pastor Search Committee has been Pastor searching, the Transition Team has been pretty much dormant. We are now being reactivated and anticipate working very closely with the Pastor Search Committee to make Jay and Lois Butcher’s move to Millfield as smooth as possible. Not only will we have a full time pastor for the first time in three years, we will have a pastor moving from the big city to a rural area where the closest mall is one hour away, depending on the stop lights in Ivor and Windsor. Jay and Lois will be learning a lot about us as a church, trying to remember the names of one hundred or so new people, but also trying to find the best pharmacy, the closest Food Lion and how, for heaven’s sake, do you get to Franklin the back way?

Wellford Tiller, our former interim pastor, shared with me that his most treasured memory of his time with us was Butch Cutright driving him around the community and pointing out where all the members lived. We don’t need to smother Jay and Lois but we also don’t want to leave them “high and dry”.

We as a team would like to have a pounding and fill the pantry at the Parsonage. We also would like to start having the Millfield Minute revived during the worship time. This will not only help the new pastor but will help all visitors and new members find out about our history. Our request to you is simple. Please e-mail Jean Felts at UVAAMF@aol.com with your favorite Millfield Minute. We will of course be repeating some but there are some new ones we can present .

The upcoming months will be exciting, and with the help of the congregation, the Transition and Pastor Search Teams can be disbanded. Amen!!!

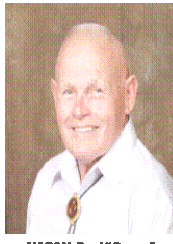

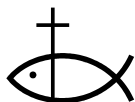
